- The "**Excellence scolaire**» Scholarship recognizes the efforts of a CSNO graduate who achieves superior academic results.

A scholarship is awarded in each of the country's three regions to highlight the academic performance and community involvement of young Francophones who care about their language and culture. The recipients of these scholarships will be announced in the fall of 2021.
